#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

You, the class of '68 have now come to the time of graduation. Congratulations! It is hoped that none will say "So What" nor, it is hoped, that any will say "Graduation - Big Deal." These "Modern" expressions are nihilistic - nihilism will neither propel you nor our society forward.

You leave high school in an age of real crisis. Our democratic idealism is in the throes of either pains of birth, or pangs of death. It is conceived that these pains and/or pangs will continue rather indecisively for the next two decades. The moment of truth will not be delayed longer, I dare predict. Thus, it is conceived that your generation will prove the decisive influence in determining whether the democratic ideal as expressed in The Declaration Of Independence, The United States Constitution, The Gettysburg Address and The 1964 Civil Rights Laws shall become real or perish from the earth for this time.

Now, think very soberly for a little while concerning the fundamental tenets of the democratic ideal. Dare compare the philosophy thereof to any and all other philosophies of government known, and reach a logical conclusion concerning the most desirable form of government as a means of enhancing human dignity and self fulfillment.

Do you believe that the very oderliness of the universe could have been but the results of chance? The democratic ideal says no; all other basic philosophies deny the universe as the work of a super-force.

Do you believe in human dignity and individual worthwhileness? Only the democratic ideal leaves credence to the positive answer to this question. Do you believe in the dignity of worthwhile productive labor? Do you believe in man's sharing his abundance so that none shall be denied a reasonably elevated floor upon which to proceed in quest of personal fulfilliment?

Only the democratic philosophy seeks to provide this elevation as a principle of government. Do you believe that man has the right to worship (or not to worship) according to his personal beliefs and insights? This guarantee can only be defined in democratic philosophy. Do you conscientiously believe that every man should have the right to choose his medium of self determination and self expression? Examine carefully every philosophy of government known to man and you must conclude that only the democratic ideal holds such to be an "Unalienable Right." Pursue the interrogations as far as you will and answer truly the question: Which philosophy offers most to self fulfilliment and personal dignity?

Now, do not confuse the philosophical ideal with present attainment and reality of democracy. Know the force of personal selfishness, bigotry, prejudice, human frailty in fulfillment of democracy. Realize rather forcibly that freedom is never guaranteed by creed nor philosophy. Know full well that, power tends to be corrosive to the extension of democracy and that institutionalized power is ultracorrosive.

This realism thus recognized, entails a constant industrious and constructive effort to keep virile the quest for freedom of self, dignity of the human being, and the right for expression of the self.

Keep alive the torch of freedom by industrious, logical, and spiritual promotion of the philosophy of the "Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man." This is the critical imperative of the day; this is really the crisis of the age. And I predict again, this generation is the decision generation which will determine whether "Government of the people, By the people and For the people" shall grow or perish from the earth in this moment of history. The next two decades will prove decisive.
